GUIDELINES FOR DONATIONS

FOR ALL DONATIONS:

- ⌘ Product must be in good condition:
 - no crushed/damaged/major dents/rust/tears/rot or mold/signs of infestation/etc
- ⌘ All items should be **sealed** and **labeled** with ingredients
- ⌘ All items should be within acceptable code date range

BEVERAGES

ACCFB does *not* distribute—

- ⌘ soda of any kind
- ⌘ Carbonated beverages (aside from water and 100% juice)
- ⌘ Alcohol or items to mix with alcohol
- ⌘ Energy drinks
- ⌘ Medical/vitamin/diet supplements
- ⌘ Anything less than 100% juice

PRODUCE

- ⌘ Any produce must be in good condition with a shelf life of at least 2—3 days (not overripe, moldy, wilted, extremely bruised, leaking)

DRY GOODS/FROZEN/REFRIGERATED ITEMS

ACCFB does *not* distribute —

- ⌘ Previously open items food items
- ⌘ Items that have been previously thawed
- ⌘ Anything discolored/foul-smelling/ freezer burned

ACCFB DOES *NOT* DISTRIBUTE:

- Candy/gum
- Expired baby food
- Ice cream
- Medicine/vitamin/diet supplements

PLEASE CHECK FIRST IF WANTING TO DONATE:

- ⌘ Gallon+ sized items or other bulk-sized (20+ lb) items

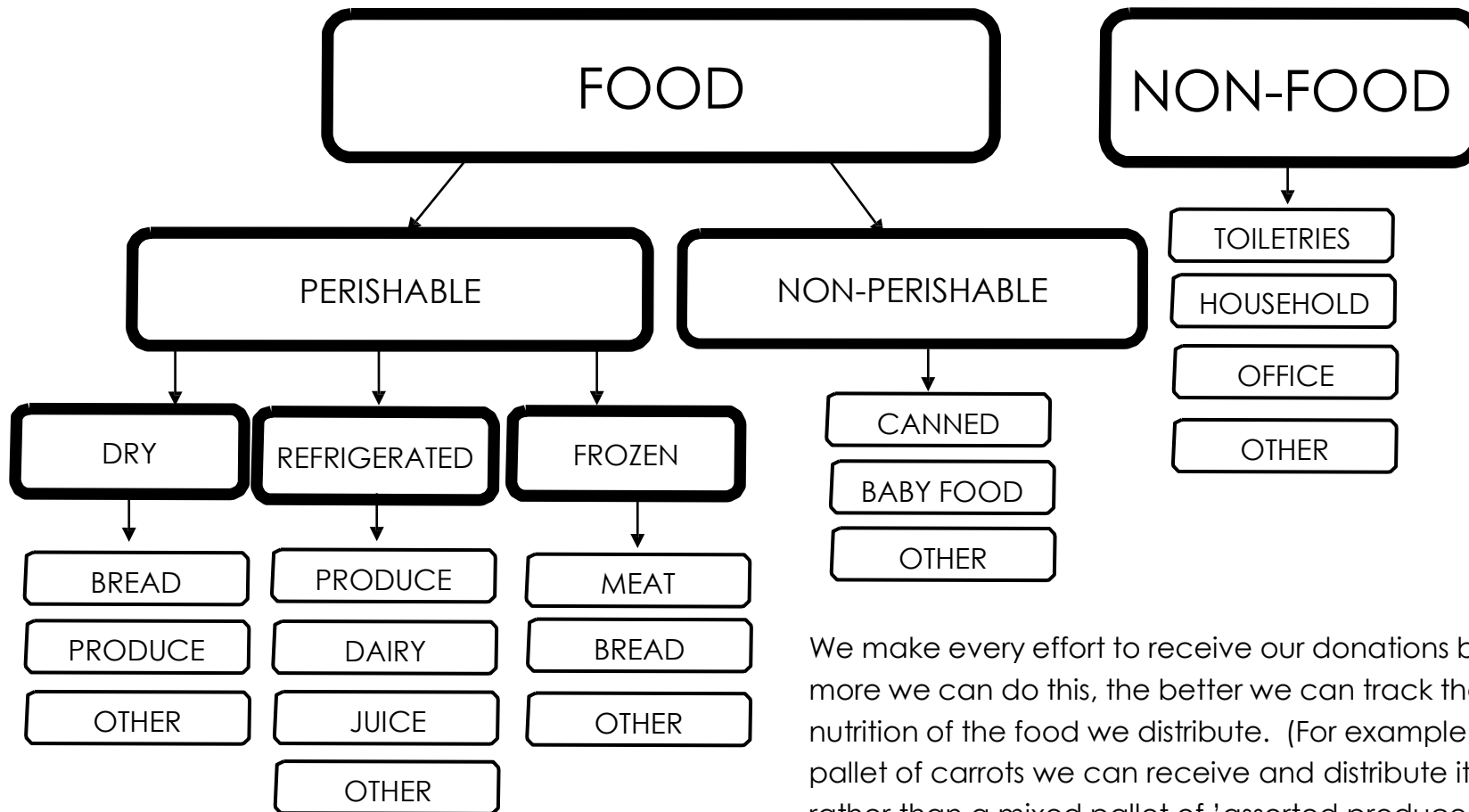
