

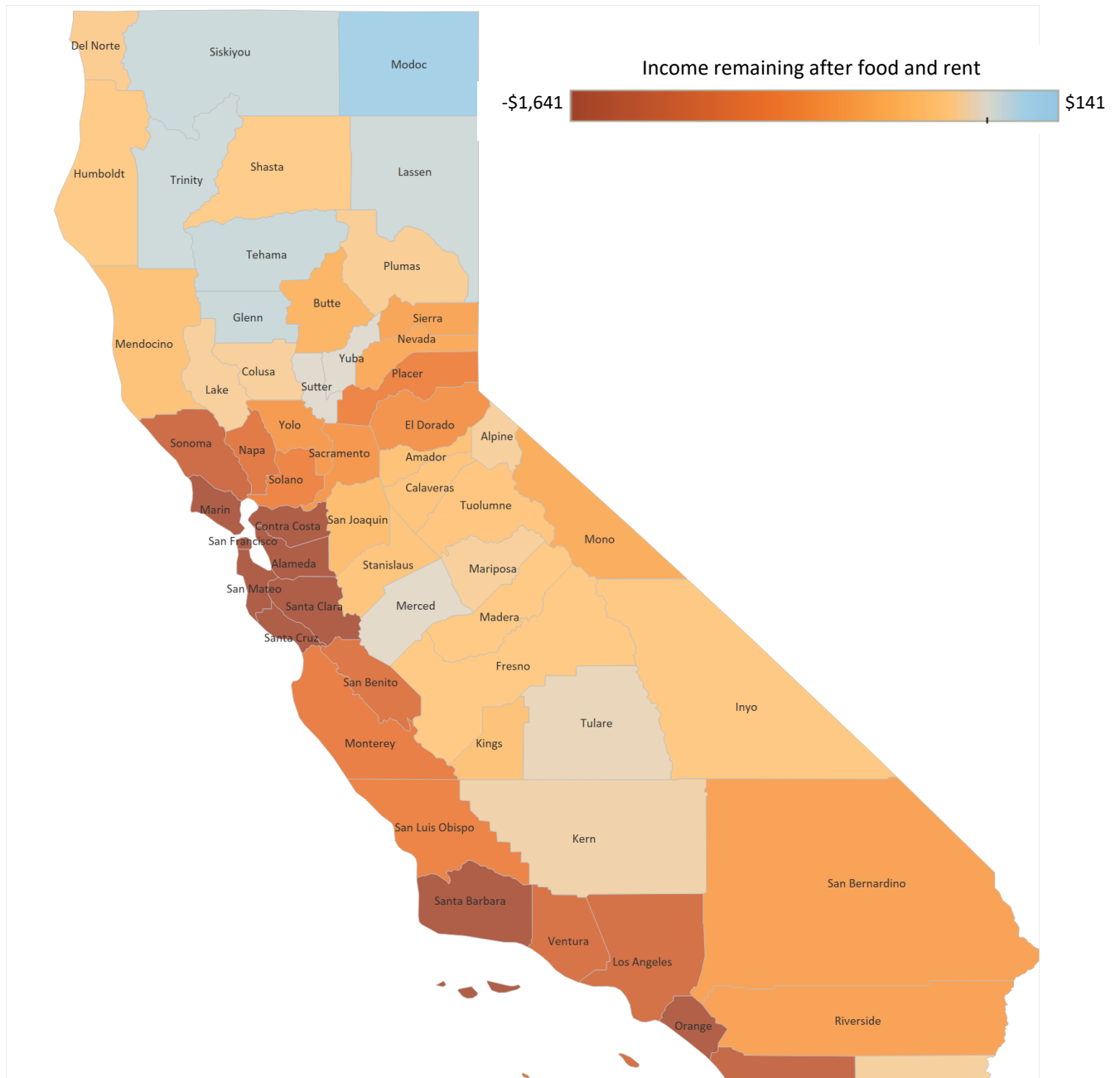
IN THE RED

Rent + food + healthcare exceeds income in ALL counties.



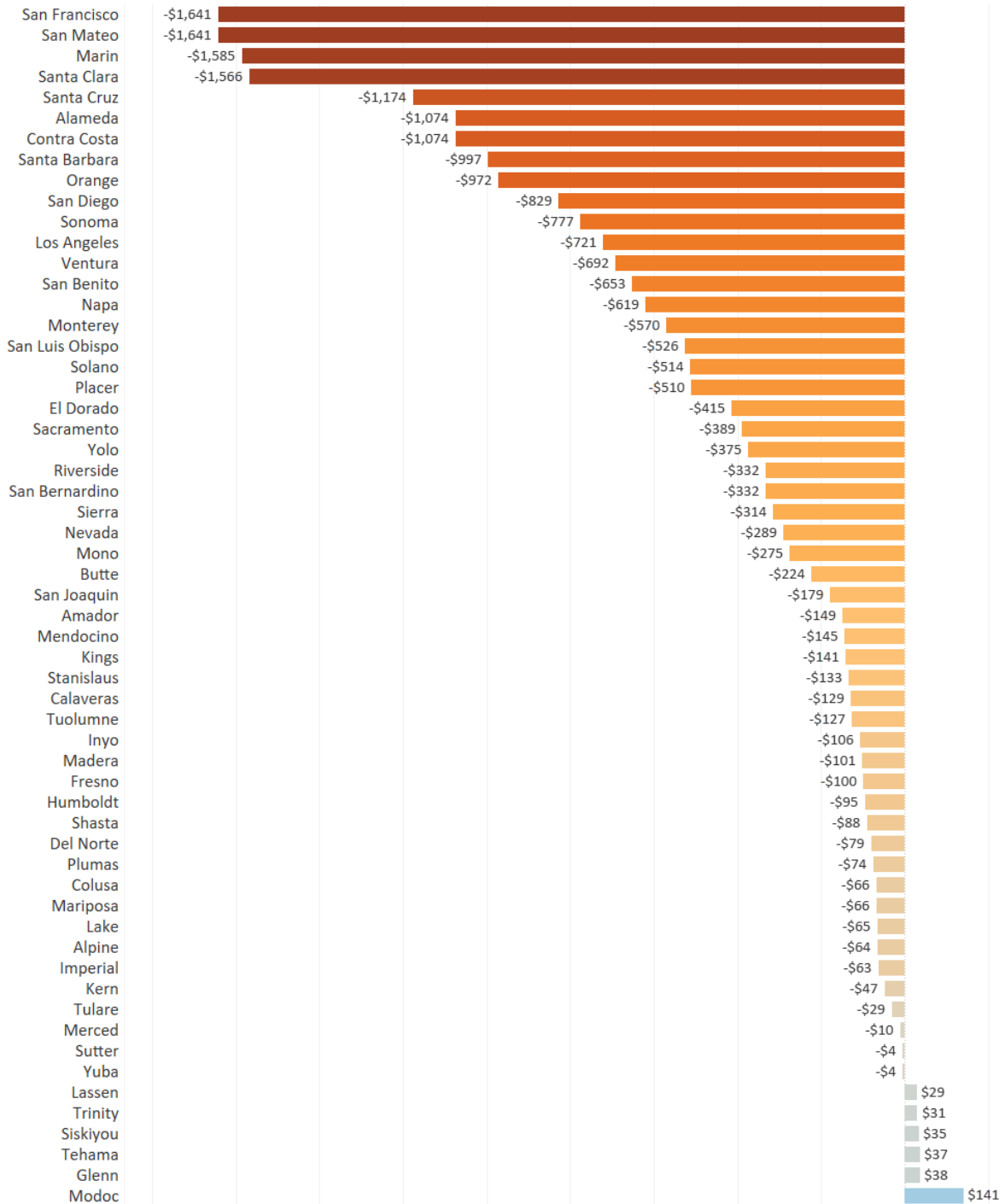

SSI GRANTS NOT ENOUGH TO COVER RENT

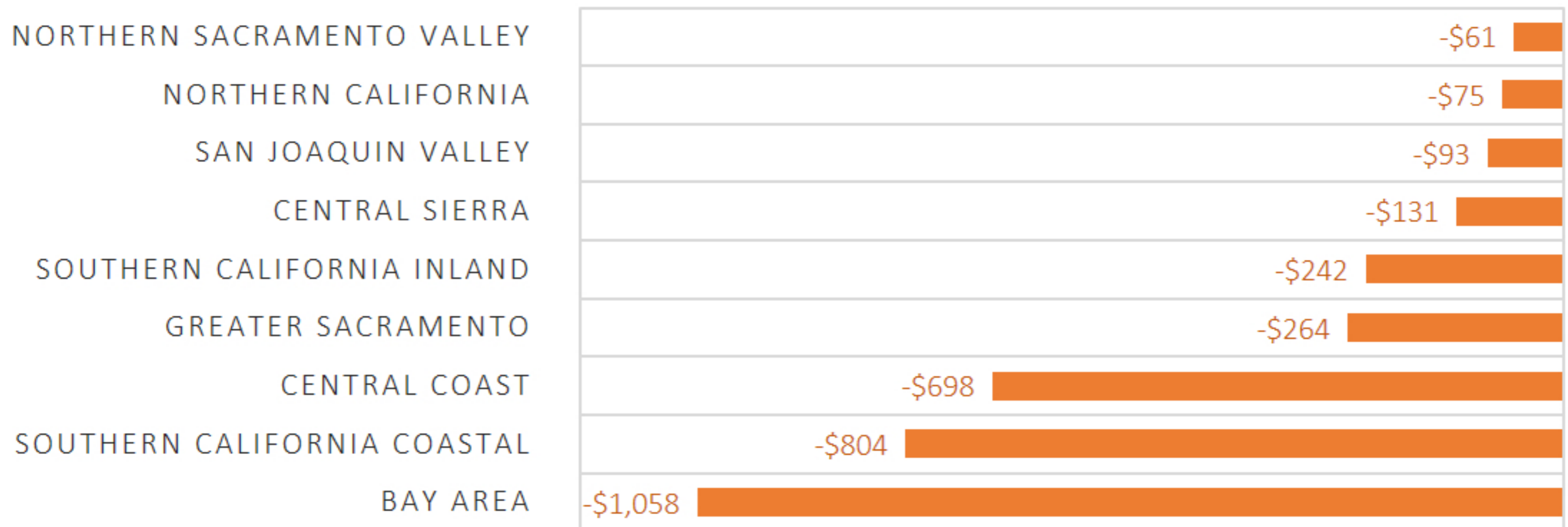
“With the way rents are, it’s the rare landlord that will even consider subsidized housing or Section 8. You just can’t get housing.”
